- o Essential Questions should be revisited many times throughout the unit
- o Students can change their thinking in relation to the Essential Questions



ESSENTIAL QUESTIONS

Should be:

- o Open ended
- Debatable
- Able to foster inquiry
- Able to promote further questions
- Re-visited frequently throughout the unit
- Be aligned with lesson concepts

WHAT MAKES A QUESTION ESSENTIAL? → gets to the heart of a subject → promotes more questions → has no simple "right" answer → is open ended to encourage thought \rightarrow is controversial \rightarrow is debatable **EXAMPLES NON-EXAMPLES** What makes a true friend? What do I need to do to become a How could alternative energy sources benefit us over time? Are electric cars better for the environment? How is geometry used in the real world? What happened at the beginning of the What is the connection between reading and story? writing?

HOW DO I WRITE AN ESSENTIAL QUESTION?

STEP ONE	Start with your topic and narrow it a little	Multiple perspectives change our thinking
STEP TWO	Use your narrowed topic to write a thesis statement	Identity and personal narrative and identity
STEP THREE	Now turn this thesis statement into a question	How does your story impact your understanding?
